19.	If the horse is being travelled in tack, the bridle and must be fastened securely before travelling. The headcollar and leadrope can be fitted correctly over the of the bridle either before being loaded (if the horse is good to load), or put on once the equine is in the trailer.
20.	The handler must wear Personal P Equipment when loading a horse. This includes: a hard hat (riding hat), g and sturdy boots with good g A long sleeve jacket and trousers are also preferable.
